What does this course offer you as an MNA?

- Candidates will be taught how to teach others and how to manage an Accredited Training Centre or Sailing Club.
- The course aims to develop a candidate's knowledge on all aspects of running a nationally recognised Training Programme.
- Ultimately the candidate will be able to aid the growth of the MNA, to positively influence the development of sailing within the MNA.
- Throughout the course candidates will develop a project around an area they want to develop upon their return home.
